



CALL FOR PAPERS



and an international airport. The city is the centre of the coastal tourism industry. The original Arabic name Manbasa: in



Kiswahili it is called Kisiwa Cha Mvita (or Mvita for short), which means "Island of War", due to the many changes in its ownership. The town is served by Moi International Airport, also known as Mombasa Airport, which is the second most important airport in Kenya after Jomo Kenyatta International Airport in Nairobi. Moi International Airport in Mombasa offers flights to many cities around the world.

There are several places to visit in Mombasa, including Fort Jesus, built by the Portuguese, and the Old Town, which shows plenty of examples of the old Islamic architecture. Biashara Street in Mombasa which in Swahili means "Trade Street" is also an old part of the city where the Indian and Arab merchants set up shop and one can now find kangas and kikovs (pl. vikoi) being sold in these small authentic shops. The famous "Light House" is a must to enjoy the native cassava crisps and coconut water during sunset.

Mombasa has a warm, tropical climate. The rainiest months April and May, while in January to February the rainfall is minimal. In the month september.

temperatures are

expected to be ranging from 20.8 °C minimum and 28.8 °C maximum.
